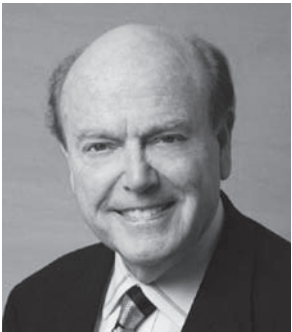

James Allen Pattison, entrepreneur (b at Saskatoon 1 Oct 1928). Pattison was raised in Vancouver. He became a used car dealer in 1952 and in 1961 bought a dealership which he built into one of the largest in Western Canada. In 1967 he acquired Neon Products, a national manufacturer and lessor of signs. Since then he has purchased over 50 other companies including airlines, soft drink producers, grocery stores and magazine distributors. Although the recession of 1982-83 led to cutbacks and layoffs in a number of his companies, the Pattison Group continued to expand and helped rekindle BC’s economic fires. A ruthlessly efficient businessman and devout Christian, Pattison’s diligent management was largely credited with the success of EXPO 86.
